
### March 10 & 11, 2025 CONFERENCE

(Re)Connecting River and City - The Seine in Paris and the Ile-de-France A Model for Nature Positive Approaches in World Heritage Cities for Climate Resilience



Conference organized by **Carola Hein**, Sorbonne University - "Major Changes" Research Chair -Water and Heritage, Professor of the History of Architecture and Urban Planning at the Delft University of Technology, Professor at the University of Leiden and at the Erasmus University in Rotterdam, holder of the UNESCO Chair "Water, Ports and Historic Cities", Director of the LDE PortCityFutures Centre, and 2024-2025 resident-fellow at the Paris IAS.

This two-days event, organized by Carola Hein, and co-organized by the Paris IAS, Sorbonne Université, UNESCO Chair on Water, Ports and Historic Cities and UNESCO World Heritage Centre, will take place in the center of Paris, echoeing the themes covered during the conference. At a time of climate change, it is urgent to rethink the relationship of residents and built heritage with rivers, seas, and other water bodies. Ecosystem thinking and value-based approaches can help (re)create livable, sustainable and just spaces in line with historical practices while protecting, adapting and learning from history and heritage.

The conference explores the multiple layers of spatial interventions and cultural practices for and with water. It focuses on four aspects of living with water, called here "water values" — swimming, shipping, safety and wastewater — and the ways in which their interaction is negotiated along the Seine in Paris and the lle de France in the context of global change as a model for World Heritage Cities. It proposes and tests a value-case approach for transdisciplinary, multi-stakeholder engagement with rivers from an ecosystem perspective. The conference therewith connects the fields of water to support the (re)launching a much-needed debate on multiple water uses to collectively create sustainable and just practices around water and their relationship to heritage at a time of climate change.

It will bring together **diverse stakeholders from academia and practice** to share their insights and expertise on multiple water uses and imaginaries in World Heritage Cities including on the Seine in Paris and the Ile de France as models for world heritage cities at a time of climate change around the world.



**Carola Hein** is Professor and Chair History of Architecture and Urban Planning at Delft University of Technology, and Professor at Leiden and Erasmus universities. She holds the UNESCO Chair Water, Ports and Historic Cities and director of the Leiden-Delft-Erasmus PortCityFutures Centre. She has published widely in the field of architectural, urban and planning history and has tied historical analysis to contemporary development. Among other major grants, she received a Guggenheim fellowship, an Alexander von Humboldt fellowship and Volkswagen Foundation grants for a mixed method digital humanities projects. Her many honors include the Sarton Medal in 2020, awarded to an outstanding scholar in the history of science. She serves as President of the International Planning History Society (IPHS).

In September 2024, Carola Hein has joined the Paris IAS for a 10-month research residency. She holds the "Major Changes" Chair, created in collaboration with Sorbonne University, on the theme of water and heritage. The research project "Water and Patrimony" studies the history and heritage of water systems in Paris and the IIe de France focused on the River Seine. In collaboration with colleagues from Sorbonne University and other stakeholders, it proposes a value-based methodology to propose new narratives and sustainable strategies for the River Seine in Paris and its watershed. The research findings will be published in a special issue of the open access journal Blue Papers.
